OASIS is a friendly charity run by parents for parents/carers who are bringing up children/young adults with Autistic Spectrum Disorder or related conditions such as Global Developmental Delay or Sensory Processing Disorder in Oxfordshire. There aim is to create a supportive community through informal coffee and chat groups, evening meetings with professional speakers, clinic nights, subsidised courses and family playdays during school holidays. • Being a member of OASIS entitles you to use their book/Sensory library, attend specialist courses and enjoy significantly subsidised playdays. You do not need to be a member to come to coffee and chat groups and clinic/evenings meetings. The annual membership fee of £16 is for the whole family including siblings, grandparents and any staff supporting your child in or outside school.



Fundraising

 OASIS is a self funding charity that rely on fundraising and donations to run their services, so are grateful for any time, money and energy that people are willing to donate. Fundraising is a good way of making friends and promoting awareness of the needs of individuals and families affected by autism. Coffee and Chat

There informal drop-in Coffee and Chat groups are a great way to meet other parents and carers. You don't have to be an OASIS member to come along and the groups are open to parents, carers, grandparents, school staff, anyone who might find benefit in chatting about their experiences or who would like support. All groups are hosted by OASIS volunteers who offer a warm friendly welcome, coffee and cake. Pre-school children and babies are more than welcome to attend with their parents. They host these coffee mornings in different areas including Oxford, Abingdon, Wantage, Didcot and Witney and are looking and expanded these further.

Clinic/Evening meeting



We hold clinic evening 2 times a year. You do not need to be a member to attend these meetings and these are open to parents, carers, family members, support staff, professionals etc to attend. No booking is required. Please note, children are not able to attend these meetings. The evenings start with coffee, cake and a chance for members to look through the book and sensory library. Then they will be able to book sessions with up to 2 professionals to talk about your individual situation/needs. These evenings are extremely popular as we have a array of professional attend it's something for everyone











Playdays



Playdays are a very important part of what OASIS does. As parents of ASD children, they understand that the school holidays can be very isolating and stressful. They run playdays in all school holidays, providing a wide range of safe and enjoyable activities for autistic children, siblings and their families. Playdays are available to members only and are offered at heavily subsidised rates. They provide a great day out, often enabling children with ASD to try new activities at an autism-friendly venue and giving parents the opportunity to meet and catch up. Most importantly, everyone support each other on playdays.



Sensory Library

The sensory library will work in a similar way to our book library. You get the chance to borrow equipment, try it in the comfort of you own home and return Nothing worse than spending your hard earned money on a piece of equipment for your child to hate. We have a huge array of equipment available.
